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GAVI “Phase 1” Evaluation: lessons learned

Comprehensive evaluation with interesting findings, however:

- Too late in the strategic planning process
- Focused more on process than results
- Too many evaluation questions

Board Recommendations – Rotterdam Retreat

Timeline

- As close as possible to ‘real-time’ in order to be useful in planning for 2011-2015

Focus on GAVI added value and outcomes

- GAVI needs more evidence of its added value
- Evaluation should include the “counterfactual”
- Evaluation should focus on outcomes
- Impact should cover full period of GAVI, but with main focus on 2006-2010

Objectives and Key Evaluation Questions

Objectives

- Assess GAVI results and added value
- Provide evidence to help inform planning for 2011-2015

Key questions

- To what extent has the GAVI Alliance met its four strategic goals?
- To what extent has the GAVI Alliance added value at the global and country levels, over and above what would be accomplished without the Alliance?

Rationale for covering 2000-2010, but with primary focus on 2006-2010

- 1st Evaluation

 - Process

- 2nd Evaluation

 - Should give full picture on results and added value since inception

 - Results linked to strategic goals (2007-2010)

 - Need to know added value from beginning

Bidding process

- Pre-announcement (last week)
- RFP issued (after board decision)
- Pre-selection (July)
 - Initial proposal
 - Pre-selection of 2-3 contractors to prepare detailed proposal with innovative evaluation plan
 - Planning grant for preparation (\$20k)

Bidding process

- Final selection (September)
 - Full proposal
 - Selected firm contracted to implement evaluation (up to US\$ 785,000)
- Draft report (March)
- Final report (April)

Criteria for pre-selection

- Evaluation framework and methods
- Proxy indicators for measurement of progress against strategic goals
- Selection of counterfactuals
- Firm's experience designing and implementing complex evaluations
- Qualifications, experience and composition of the evaluation team
- Developing country partners

Final proposals

- Detailed description of:
 - Framework
 - Methods
 - Indicators
 - Counterfactuals
- Criteria and rationale for choice of country studies
- Detailed workplan, budget, timeline
- Detailed CVs

Management of evaluation

- GAVI Secretariat
 - Management of bidding process
 - Management of evaluation
- Oversight by GAVI Board through Evaluation Advisory Committee
